“The Holiest Week of the Year”

Holy Week is the high point and center of the Christian Church Year. It is the week when the Church commemorates Jesus’ coming into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday all the way through to His resurrection on Easter morning. It is a week filled with special church services that focus on laments and songs of penitence, and concludes with the victory of Christ’s resurrection.

Palm Sunday for Trinity Lutheran Church begins with a procession for some members to the Civic Center Mall at 10 a.m. to join other downtown churches for prayer and singing. At 10:30, Trinity’s members march in our own Palm Sunday processional from the meditation garden to the church nave. The Palm Sunday - Passion Sunday service also includes the Passion History of our Lord from Mark’s Gospel.

The Maundy Thursday Communion Service will include the ancient tradition of foot washing, a symbol of the humble service all Christians are ready to undertake in the name of Jesus. The Good Friday Service will feature Tenebrae, a “Service of Darkness” centered on the words of Jesus from the cross. Please note that the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services are both at 7:30 instead of 7 p.m.

“A New Creation”

The time had run off the clock, Louisville was ahead, but the Tigers' Darius Washington had been fouled and was at the free throw line with a chance to win the game. Tiger basketball fans know the painful story – he missed all three shots, and the arch-rival Cardinals won. What a missed opportunity! Oh, for the chance to do it over!

We've all had occasions when we wished we could get a “do-over” – take back the words we just said or speak the ones we should have, lend a helping hand to the person we neglected, have a second chance to do the right thing.

Here's a news flash: we Christians do get a second chance! And a third. And a fourth. In fact, St. Paul tells us, we have become *brand new people!* “So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!” (2 Corinthians 5:17)

The early baptistries of the Christian Church were often decorated with artwork depicting the flood of Noah's time. We sometimes talk about baptism as a washing away of our sins, but it is perhaps more akin to a re-birth. Just as the sinful world came out fresh and new from the destructive flood, so our baptism into Christ's death gives us the chance to begin again as new-born creatures.

A major theme of Lent is the opportunity for new life bestowed on us through the water and Word of baptism. Death, re-birth and resurrection are the primary focus of our Holy Week services. On Maundy Thursday the emphasis is on confession. Good Friday we focus on Christ's sacrificial death. At the Easter Vigil we share in the renewal of our baptism. Easter is about resurrection, both Christ's and our own.

When he was distressed and despairing, Martin Luther is said to have taken great comfort in the knowledge that he was baptized. On those occasions when we wish we could have a “do-over,” we, too, can rejoice in the new creation we have become through God's gracious gift of baptism

Holy Week Schedule

Palm Sunday - April 5th

Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday will include Procession of the Palms, commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and the Passion Story from the Gospel of Mark.

Maundy Thursday - April 9th

Maundy Thursday marks the beginning of the longest church service of the year, completed on Easter morning. At 7:30 p.m. we will remember Jesus' command to “love one another” as demonstrated in the washing of the disciples' feet, and will share in the meal Jesus instituted the night he was betrayed.

Good Friday - April 10th

On April 10th, Good Friday, we will hold a Tenebrae Service at 7:30 p.m. This “Service of Darkness” vividly depicts the darkness that covered the world at the death of Jesus and the darkness of sin

that still permeates our lives today.

Easter Vigil - April 11th

At 8:30 p.m. Saturday, Trinity will observe one of the most ancient liturgies of the Christian Church. Christ's victory over death is proclaimed in new fire, salvation history, baptism, and the first communion of Easter.

The Resurrection of Our Lord - April 12th

A 7:00 a.m. Easter Sunrise Service continues our celebration of Christ's victory over sin and death with Easter hymns and readings, Easter message and celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Trinity's Youth Group will host an Easter Breakfast from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. An Easter Egg Hunt will be held in the Meditation Garden after the 10:30 Service.

The 10:30 a.m. Easter Festival Service will feature Easter hymns and readings, anthems from Trinity's choir, Easter message and celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Council Report

Trinity's Church Council met March 15. Pastor Wiese reported on the ill. The General Fund budget had a deficit of \$5,244 as of the end of February.

In Old Business, the Council received a revised proposal from the Trinity Renaissance and Oversight Committee regarding the rest of the fellowship hall renovation. A motion was made and passed to ask all church boards to meet on Sunday, March 29, after the worship service to review the proposal and make recommendations to the committee. The four cemetery lots at Forest Hill Midtown Cemetery still have not been sold. The asking price is \$400 per lot.

In New Business, the Council approved receiving into membership by adult confirmation Amye Winger and her son Nicholas Thomas. The Council also approved a recommendation from the Board of Finance to accept from the LCMS Mid-South District the \$15,000 funding for Circle of Inspiration. Vernetta Eddleman is the director of this program for abused wives that meets at Trinity twice a month.

The next Council meeting will be April 19th. The meeting was adjourned and closed with prayer.

“Fan Into Flame”

The 2004 Synodical Convention of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod endorsed a mission education, critical funding campaign for new ministries and expanded mission outreach in the Synod’s 35 districts and 6,000+ congregations. The goal of “Fan into Flame” is one hundred million dollars raised or pledged by Synod’s congregations and members by the July, 2010 Synod Convention.

Over 44 million dollars was already raised by February 1st of this year.

“Fan into Flame” is patterned after Jesus’ instructions to His disciples in Acts 1:8: “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” The breakdown of recipients for the “Fan into Flame” campaign is: local congregation (Jerusalem) - 15%, district (Judea) - 15%, US missions (Samaria) - 20% and international missions (ends of the earth) - 50%

The Mid-South District will have a major kickoff for its churches at the District Convention this June. Trinity Church is one of a few congregations asked to be early participants in the campaign, providing campaign models and encouragement to other district churches to participate in this campaign.

The first phase of Trinity’s campaign includes meetings with a few key leaders and supporters during March and April to invite some advanced gifts. The congregational phase begins on Easter Sunday (April 12th) and concludes on Pentecost Sunday (May 31st)

There will be six weeks of mission education through “The Candle,” bulletins and Bible classes. It concludes on Pentecost Sunday with a call for pledges and contributions. A full report on Trinity’s campaign will be given to the District Convention in June.
