

“Fan into Flame”

Trinity Lutheran Church is one of four congregations in the Mid-South District who are early participants for the “*Fan into Flame*” funding campaign. These four churches will provide helpful campaign models and good encouragement for the other 125+ Mid-South District congregations to participate in this synod-wide campaign this fall and winter.

The first phase of Trinity’s campaign has had great success. A dozen of Trinity’s leaders and supporters met in March to learn more about the exciting work being accomplished through “*Fan into Flame*” . In response to what they heard, they have given or pledged over \$18,000 toward the suggested goal of \$28,000 for Trinity congregation. This means we are already almost two-thirds of the way towards meeting Trinity’s goal!

One of the unique parts of this synod-wide critical funding campaign is that 15% of the money raised by congregations goes back to those congregations to fund their special mission programs. Trinity’s 15% will be going into Trinity’s Special Ministry Fund, a fund that needs to be replenished. Over the past 10 years, over \$15,000 of that fund has been given to aid six area Lutheran ministries and two of Trinity’s vicars.

Another unique feature of “*Fan into Flame*” is that another 15% goes back to the districts. The Mid-South District has selected four vital areas of ministry to receive “*Fan into Flame*” support: planting one additional new district mission each year, assisting more struggling churches so they can once again become healthy congregations; supporting more mission planters in Tanzania, and providing additional scholarship aid for Mid-South students planning to become full-time church workers. Over \$438,000 has already been raised or pledged toward the 1.1 million dollar district goal!

Each Sunday during May, one aspect of “*Fan into Flame*” will be shared with the congregation in the worship services. A letter with more information and a commitment card will be mailed to all members the middle of May. The campaign will culminate with an ingathering of gifts and pledges on May 31st, Pentecost Sunday. I invite all members of Trinity to study the exciting information you will receive and prayerfully consider how you can be a vital participant in this once-a-decade synod-wide offering.

“Unlocking Closed Doors”

The Sundays after Easter give us an opportunity to explore the ways the risen Christ showed himself to his disciples and friends. At the pastors conference at Christ the King this week, Pastor Mark Goble, in the devotion, said he has always been impressed with how real and forward Jesus was with his disciples. I agree, and believe that the ways in which Jesus met them were intended to help us understand that the Easter message is real for us as well.

He called Mary by name. She arrived at the tomb expecting to finish the burial rites but found no body. However, she heard and recognized Jesus’ voice and wanted to hug him – a natural response. The same is true for Thomas. He, too, wanted to touch the risen Lord, and – just to be sure it’s the same one who was crucified – touched his hands and feet. Jesus said to him, “How blessed are those who have not seen, yet believe.”

Jesus appeared to his disciples as they huddled behind locked doors. The doors were locked because they were afraid. We all know the reality of living in places with locked doors. Yet, in those locked rooms, Jesus gave the disciples the “keys of the kingdom,” words of forgiveness and peace. I think he did that so that we could experience the same peace that Jesus gave to those disciples.

The Church is called the body of Christ. We are the ones who hold the keys to open those locked doors, to dispel the fears people live with. Mary wanted to hug the risen Jesus. She couldn’t do that, but she could hug John. We can hug one another with the assurance that Jesus forgives our sins, removes our doubts, assures us of His presence even behind our locked doors. We carry those keys which open new ways of experiencing the risen Christ in our homes and lives.

“Too Much!”

What a whirlwind of a week! As I write this the Saturday after Easter, I look back on Holy Week with a sense of awe at the tremendous spiritual blessings of this unique time. We began with a triumphant procession on Palm Sunday, to be brought down to earth by the account of Jesus’ suffering and death. On Maundy Thursday we heard once again Jesus’ new commandment, “Love one another.” We stood at the foot of the cross on Good Friday, looking for a language to use to thank our Lord; on Saturday, we felt the hope of the Vigil with its recounting of God’s salvation history. Finally, the triumph of Easter Sunday arrived with the news, “Christ is risen!”

Somebody said of our Holy Week worship at Trinity, “It’s just too much.” And it is. The story of Christ’s death on the cross and his resurrection is simply too much to comprehend. And yet, each year, through the retelling of the story, I understand a bit more.

If Holy Week is overwhelming for us, just imagine the impact these events had on those first disciples! Jesus’ entrance into Jerusalem with the crowd cheering him on; Jesus adding the words to the familiar Passover ritual, “This is my body.... This is my blood;” the horror of Christ’s death and finality of his burial. And then, the unbelievable news of Christ’s resurrection. Despite having walked with him for three years, the disciples didn’t immediately understand the implications of the events of that amazing week.

In the days after his resurrection, Jesus appeared many times to his followers. I suspect with each appearance, Peter, James, John and the rest comprehended a bit more. But it took the blessing of God’s Spirit coming upon them at Pentecost to really open their eyes and hearts.

Things aren’t very different for us. Even though we have the advantage of knowing how the story ends, we still need the help of God’s Spirit to truly comprehend the difference Christ’s death and resurrection – the difference Christ’s love - brings to our lives. Christ is risen!

Council Report

Trinity's Church Council met April 19. The Treasurer reported

that February's General Fund deficit of \$5,200 decreased to \$923 in March. The Trustees are arranging for carpentry work to be done at the church. The Board of Education will supply a cake for Confirmation Sunday. The Board of Evangelism is preparing for Trivia Night April 25. The Board of Hospitality will host a lunch after the Confirmation service on May 3rd. A Bake Sale will be held May 17th. The Board of Youth will help with Trivia Night, hold a Plant Sale in May, and are planning a trip to East Tennessee in July. The youth made \$200 on the Easter breakfast.

OLD BUSINESS:

Plans for renovations to the Fellowship Hall were discussed. Several boards had concerns regarding some of the larger expenditures. David Chester will take these concerns back to the Trinity Renaissance Committee. A motion was made and carried to set up a separate Renovation Account for any funds designated for the renovation. A motion was also made and carried to select a project manager to oversee the renovation funds and projects.
