The point is that, while it takes a little time, the anticipation of the ketchup is part of its appeal, knowing the taste is worth the wait.

Many of you are eager to get going on the next phase of Trinity’s life and ministry, and start the process of calling your next “settled” pastor. Facets of that step are already taking place. Your Transition Task Force (TTF) is reviewing the results of the information I have been gathering on their behalf as a part of my visiting with nearly 60 Trinity households. (I am still glad to meet with any of you with whom I have not yet visited, both to get to know you and to pass on your input to the TTF.)

What are the main things you say you want to see as a part of Trinity’s next ministry phase? Some of them include: an expanded and increased focus upon ministry to and for Trinity’s youth; attracting members from the large influx of professional people – especially younger people and younger families with children – who have moved into Mud Island and downtown; continuing to be known as a place for quality, traditional worship; continuing to be a partner with others in meeting the unique service and social needs of people in and near downtown Memphis.

What suggestions have been made as to how to accomplish these aims? These include: “plant” some people - “missionaries,” if you will - in these new downtown housing areas with the specific task of building relationships with the residents, thereby earning the right to invite their new friends to come with them to Trinity; hold home Bible studies in these areas to, again, build relationships and earn the right to extend invitations to Trinity; look into opening a daycare, which would put the congregation in touch with young families to build relationships; budget more resources for youth worker staffing; consider purchasing a nearby building for use for expanded youth programming/daycare/parking; sponsor events such as dog shows, a blessing of the pets service, or dog training demonstrations to build relationships with the many pet owners in the downtown area; hold lecture series of interest to various age/interest groups to meet and build relationships between new people and existing members so that invitations can be extended to Trinity’ call a pastor whose passions, interest, and skill-sets match up with these ideas so that he can join with the congregation in leading and equipping members for this next phase of its ministry.

You’ll be hearing more. What an exciting time at Trinity!

## “The Faith of a Child”

My Grandma Israel died the end of October, 1963. The things that stuck in my eight-year-old memory were skipping church to make the drive to Chicago on a Sunday, the hymns that were sung at the funeral, and asking my mother why – since Grandma was in heaven – Aunt Marion was sad. My first up-close encounter with death was not traumatic, in large part because my parents accepted it as part of life, and answered my questions simply and honestly.

As a young adult I once again viewed death from a child’s perspective as our family helped my two young nephews cope with the sudden death of their Granddaddy and, a few years later, of my father. Each of the boys had different questions and different reactions. Parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles did their best to answer questions and to demonstrate that God loves and cares for us even in the midst of our grief.

A couple of weeks ago, my family gathered in Nashville to commend to God’s gracious care my Aunt Marion, who, at age 89, has joined her parents, husband, and brother in heaven. Again, there was a child present - my great-nephew John, age 6, who had a lot of questions.

His grandmother explained that some of us were crying because we’re going to miss this sweet lady, but that the ending to the story is very happy. His grandfather assured him that Aunt Marion is in heaven, and the only thing in that box was her body, which she no longer needs. As we stayed to see the casket lowered into the grave, sealed, and covered with dirt, John’s parents and uncles answered still more questions.

Sooner or later, our children come face-to-face with the hard facts of life, including the death of loved ones. We need to be ready to answer their questions, and share with them our faith in Christ’s resurrection. John readily accepted explanations from a family he trusts. God invites us to trust Him in the same way. May we all be blessed with a child-like faith – and be prepared to share it with our children.

## “Preparing the Way”

Trinity’s Transition Task Force (TTF) is tasked to prepare the way for our next pastor. What this really means is preparing our congregation to receive our next pastor. Some might say, “We are prepared, so let’s get going.” We are close, but not quite there yet.

Pastor Myers has been very active in meeting with our membership in order to get a sense of where we are and where we want to go. He has done a superb job of gathering this information that we need as part of our call process.

Probably the greatest challenge facing our new pastor will be growing our church. Pastor Wiese did a great job of holding our congregation together. However, in recent years he was so over-burdened in managing our church business and affairs that there was little time to “grow” our congregation. We don’t want this to happen with our next pastor.

A major priority in “growing” our church is completing the renovations on our first floor. Pastor Myers advises that this is necessary in order to attract visitors and retain them as new members. The Renovations and Oversight committee will be presenting to the Church Council recommendations for completing these renovations.

Trinity is in an excellent position to benefit from the renovation and growth of downtown Memphis. While we are preparing God’s “lighthouse” to receive visitors and prospective members, we need to develop and implement ways of approaching the downtown residential neighborhoods. We can comfortably seat 265 people in our nave, yet we averaged only 126 per Sunday service last year. Our 20-year average is 133. We have room to grow, and we *must* grow in order to carry out our mission.

We are the right church, with the right congregation, with the right mission, in the right place. All we need to do is follow the Lord, prepare the way, and get it done.

The council met June 6. Pastor Myers reported that he has been visiting the sick, and has so far met with 34 families, gathering information for the congregational self-study. The closing on the parsonage is set for June 15, 2010. Tim Tenner reported that minor repairs have been made to the house. Bill Otte reported that the General Fund deficit is \$12,000. The Board of Evangelism is planning a Marriage Enrichment Conference, and the Board of Social Ministry is working on more clothing drives for the year. The Board of Hospitality will host a luncheon June 27<sup>th</sup>. The Board of Youth has plans for a servant event at Grace Lutheran in Knoxville this summer.

### New Business:

**MEMBERSHIP CHANGES:** Upon the recommendation of the Board of Elders, the Council approved the transfer of Debra Stoker Kinsley to St. John Lutheran Church in Williston, NY; and the release from membership of Michael McCormack.

Dave Chester recommended we refocus on a Renaissance and Oversight Committee to finish renovations to the Fellowship Hall. The 12-member committee will meet to gather information to present to the council regarding renovations. The Council approved this recommendation. Earl Williams has resigned his position as Elder. The Council voted to name Douglas Morrison to fill this position.

The next meeting will be held August 8<sup>th</sup>. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

## Hospitality HUB

The Hospitality Hub at 146 Jefferson opened its doors in Downtown Memphis in 2007 “to connect homeless people with the resources they need to begin their journey out of homelessness.” Directory Beatrice Kimmons has over 20 years experience working with homeless persons. The three paid staff members are ably assisted by over 35 volunteers.

The HUB continues to expand its hours and services. They have “drop in” hours on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, counseling services, and recently began offering legal clinics. Whether the need is for drug rehab, a job, mental health counseling, a birth certificate or state ID, a mailing address, or simply a friendly face and a cup of coffee, the HUB is there to help homeless people move from the streets into productive lives.

Meet Herman, one of the HUB’s guests: Herman is 47 years old and has been a guest at the HUB as long as anyone can remember. He had been on the streets for many years, has a drinking problem and is schizophrenic. An army veteran, he had started receiving disability in 2004 but for some unknown reason, his check was cut off. Over the years, Herman got his mail at the HUB, received his birth certificate and ID, maintained a locker, and received hygiene products and bus tickets from the HUB. It also became very clear that Herman needed a little extra help.

In the spring of 2009, Herman’s life took a real positive turn. After connecting him with our VA representative, Herman got stabilized on medication, kept regular appointments at the VA, and started the process of reapplying for disability benefits. In December, 2009 he was taken into a transitional shelter, House of Prayer. Sober for 7 months, Herman is in charge of the house cleaning and yard work at House of Prayer.
